In 1990, her busy life as a solo practitioner of internal medicine and mother of three was interrupted by a diagnosis of cancer. All these years, she has been exploring the role of hope in survivorship.

In this thought-provoking presentation, Dr. Harpham discusses what hope is and how hope works. She shares insights on assessing if patients' hopes are healing, as well as dealing with the problem of false hope. She offers insights and tips about how clinicians can guide patients to healing hope, namely hope that helps them get good care and live as fully as possible. As clinicians, you'll be inspired to embrace the many opportunities to nourish healing hope in your patients – and in yourself.

**Wendy S. Harpham, MD, FACP**, is a doctor of internal medicine, 28-year cancer survivor, best-selling author and nationally recognized speaker. She's written 8 books on survivorship and writes an award-winning regular column in *Oncology Times*, "View from the Other Side of the Stethoscope." The American College of Physicians honored her with the 2018 Nicholas E. Davies Award for Scholarly Activities in the Humanities.
