

As part of the qualifying team event, students are to create CANCER RISK REDUCTION PUBLIC HEALTH poster geared towards teens. This poster round will be ten percent of the overall score in the team event. This poster component helps Rutgers School of Public Health achieve the goal in cancer education and prevention.

Themes:

- Preventing youth from smoking
- Health Eating in Teens
- Youth life style choice to prevent cancer
- Encourage youth to use sun protection

Poster Requirements

Posters must be the student's original work. Copyrighted clip art and characters will not be accepted.

Materials:

A variety of media may be used, including but not limited to paint, crayons, chalk, and markers. Brighter colors are preferred as light marks will decrease legibility. Depth on the poster is restricted to half an inch. The poster should be easy to see and read when on display.

Poster Size:

Minimum: 8 ½" x 11" Maximum: 18" x 24"

Judging Procedure

One poster will be created per team. The poster must include the attached released form. Posters may be mailed in prior to the event or brought with the team on the day of. If mailing the poster, please send to:

Judging Criteria

- 1. Conveys a clear message
- 2. One of the themes listed above is addressed
- 3. Creativity, originality and artistic quality
- 4. Legibility when displayed
- 5. Bright and colorful
- 6. Release Form attached to back of poster
- 7. No copyrighted artwork, characters, or name brands within poster
