RUYES for Students

Students in the RUYES program will:

- Engage in mentorsupervised basic, clinical, or population-based cancer research for ten weeks per summer for two consecutive years.
- Participate in co-curricular and professional development activities.
- Participate in community outreach and engagement activities.
- Receive compensation to participate in the program.

Who Is Eligible?

To be eligible for the RUYES program a student must be:

- A rising high school senior or rising freshman/sophomore undergraduate
- From one of the following underrepresented backgrounds:
 - African American
 - Hispanic/Latino
 - Native American
 - Alaska Native
 - Pacific Islander
 - A first generation college student
 - From a lower socioeconomic background
- A citizen or permanent resident (green card holder) of the United States.
- 16 years of age as of June 15th in the application year

RUYES for High School Teachers

Science teachers from high schools with significant proportions of students from underrepresented backgrounds will have the opportunity to:

- Conduct basic, clinical, or population-based cancer research for eight weeks during two consecutive summers.
- Receive support to design innovative cancer science curricula they can take back to their class-rooms.
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- Develop and implement outreach and engagement activities for students, families, and the community in their school districts.
- Receive compensation to participate in the program.
