## Tobacco Cessation Services For the LGBTQ+ Community: Working with Transgender Clients

- → If your program does not require legal/ government documentation, transgender and non-transgender clients should not be asked to share their legal/government name.
- → If your program does require legal/government documentation, include a section on intake forms labeled "government/legal name," along with a section labeled "preferred name."



- → Always refer to transgender people using their preferred name.
- → Avoid "deadnaming" your transgender clients, or referring to a transgender person using their birth name instead of their preferred name.
- → Some transgender people may have changed their legal name to match their preferred name, and others may not have.

## **Quick Tip:**

Sex assigned at birth, gender identity, and sexual orientation are three different things.

Knowing one does not necessarily tell you anything about the others. In order to be transaffirming, providers must take into account all aspects of a person's identity.
