Elaheh is a PhD candidate at Rutgers Cancer Institute, where she began her doctoral training in 2021 and joined Dr. Kyle Payne's laboratory in 2022. Her dissertation investigates the tumor cell—intrinsic role of BLTP3A, a novel tumor microenvironmental stress-response molecule, in high-grade serous ovarian cancer (HGSOC). Her work is supported by the prestigious NIH/NCI F99/K00 Predoctoral-to-Postdoctoral Transition Award.
